You Are God's Poem

- 1. You Are God's Poem
 - a. Ephesians 2:8-10
 - b. In other words, we are not saved "by works", but we are saved "for works".
 - i. We are His workmanship
 - 1. workmanship (*poiēma*) [poy'-ay-mah]
 - a. Literally, a thing made, a work, workmanship.
 - 2. A root of our English word "poem"
 - 3. "You are God's poem!".
 - 4. Only other usage is Romans 1:20
 - ii. created in (ktisthentes) having been created
 - iii. works (*ergois*) to work, accomplish" a work or worker who accomplishes something. "Work" is a deed (action) that carries out (completes) an inner desire (intension, purpose).
 - 1. An erg is approximately the amount of work done (or energy consumed) by one common house fly performing one "push up," the leg-bending dip that brings its mouth to the surface on which it stands and back up.
 - iv. beforehand (*proētoimasen*) made ready in advance; hence, "ready, already prepared"
 - 1. Only other usage is Romans 9:23
 - c. Ephesians 1:4
 - i. God not only prepared for our salvation in advance, but also prepared for the good works that follow.
 - ii. Walk worthy of the Lord fully pleasing Him
 - iii. Being fruitful in every good work
 - d. Romans 12:1
 - i. spiritual (logikēn) divinely reasonable
 - ii. worship (*latreian*) service rendered to God, perhaps simply worship, but much more that God finds reasonable and pleasing.
 - e. Colossians 3:17
 - f. Romans 12:4-8
 - It is beyond coincidence that these functions are placed in close proximity to the idea of presenting our bodies as a living sacrifice.

- ii. Also underscores the teaching that one member cannot think of self as more important than another member.
- iii. 1 Corinthians 12:15
- iv. The church has a God-given organization, but may also be thought of as a living organism, with each organ serving an important purpose.
- v. If it seems to you that you are not an important member, you may be a ligament that holds all the joints together, or a vessel that carries nutrients to different parts of the body.

 - zealous fervent, ardent, fervid, fanatical, passionate, impassioned, devout, devoted, committed, dedicated, enthusiastic, eager, keen, avid, card-carrying, vigorous, energetic, intense, fierce;
 - 2. Romans 12:11
 - e. Good works bear fruit.
 - i. Colossians 1:9-10
 - f. Good works glorify God.
 - i. Matthew 5:16
 - ii. 1 Peter 2:11-12
 - g. Good works accompany faith.
 - i. James 2:14-26
 - h. Insist on good works.
 - i. Titus 3:8
