<b>prayer</b> <i>proseuche</i>	prayer (to God), <b><i>exchange of wishes</i></b> a place for prayer (used by Jews, perhaps where there was no synagogue – i.e. Acts 16:13).	Eph. 6:18 Phil. 4:6 1 Tim. 2:1 1 Tim. 5:5
<b>supplication</b> <i>deésis</i>	heart-felt petition, arising out of deep personal need (sense of lack, want). praying for a specific, felt need.	Eph. 6:18 Phil. 4:6 1 Tim. 2:1 1 Tim. 5:5
<b>thanksgiving</b> <i>eucharistias</i>	the giving of thanks for God's grace.	Phil. 4:6 1 Tim. 2:1
<b>intercession</b> <i>enteuxeis</i>	intervention - intersection which literally "hits the mark"; intervention led by God, marking intersection between heaven and earth as it reflects the Lord's specific will.	1 Tim 2:1

  - really - *No means of support; no family to help.*
  - *Widow of Nain – Luke 7:11-16*

	Translation	Used In
<b>prayers</b> <i>deēseis</i> (deh'-ay-sis)	heart-felt petition, arising out of deep personal need (sense of lack, want). praying for a specific, felt need.	Heb. 5:7
<b>supplication</b> <i>hiketērias</i> (hik-et-ay-ree'-ah)	literally, an olive branch; figuratively, earnest supplication for peace (relief, reconciliation), from a sense of helplessness, surrender (used only in Heb 5:7).	Heb. 5:7

- **Mark 14:32-42**
- **Psalm 22**
- **Luke 22:41-44**
  - Luke records a physiological detail – sweat became like great drops of blood.
  - Heb. 5:7 - was heard because of His godly fear. The angel may have been part of the answer.
  - He was in agony, knowing the suffering to come shortly.
  - If there is any other way to save mankind and spare me this agony?
  - Yet not what I will, but what You will
- **Hebrews 5:7-9**
- In his *helplessness*, he prayed to his father.
- **Hebrews 12:1-2**
  - Did God hear his prayers? Here is the full answer – who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross
- **A line from a song you know:**
  - *That Christ hath regarded my helpless estate*
  - *And hath shed his own blood for my soul.*
- **Don't lose heart!**
  - Luke 18:1
  - He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him,
  - Are you helpless? Is there some situation that you are helpless to handle? Don't lose heart!
  - Do you need to obey him? That is why he endured the shame and agony of the cross!
