## **HIGHLIGH OF ACTIVITIES**

Early morning on Tuesday we boarded the bus with Honore on the driving wheel and headed on to Parakou. We stopped in Bohicon to meet briefly with Paul. We also stopped in Dassa and in Save to meet with three of the preachers who live in these town. We met Pascal working on building his new residence on the church lot. We got to Parakou after 8 hours on the bus. Early morning we went to the new building of the Parakou church. Several members were waiting for us including The Preacher. visitors Daniel. the inspected the building and took lots of pictures. Ed gave a short exhortation and we got back on the bus for the 7 hour ride back to the Zinvie campus.

Thursday was rest day but Ed, Brandon and Jeff and I went to visit our very good friend Michel Alokpo who is a member of Cabinet for our Ministry of Interior (Home Affairs). He took us to see a government Minister, the Minister for Administrative and Institutional Reforms Mr. SOUNTON Martial. We had earlier sent him a letter of invitation to our graduation ceremony. The Minister attended the graduation ceremony accompanied by Michel and a Senator by name David. The Minister spoke during the ceremony. We invited the ORTB-TV, which is the

national TV station to do a news cover our ceremony.

Friday and Saturday July 8-9 were for the Youth Lectures. Three men spoke on Friday morning and three in the evening. We had four lectures on Saturday morning. All the sessions ended with several questions from the audience.

All the lectureship participants stayed on the campus. Some slept in the classrooms. On the day of the graduation ceremony 800 meals had been served but some could not get a meal. On Saturday June 11th we had our auarterlv Preachers meeting and we requested all who have skills to respond to our call. We had Sister Marina who worships in the Vedoko congregation to prepare refreshment for our invited guests during the ceremony. She did a marvelous job. The women did so much work, working so far into the night trying to feed the never ceasing stream of visitors.

One person who distinguished himself during the occasion is Honore, our driver. He drove the big Yellow American school bus on our terrible roads. The road from the main highway to BTC is washed off due to heavy rains and he maneuvers the bus somehow through to always get us home safely.
